Message from the Chair

I am pleased to present the Pandemic Response Accountability Committee's (PRAC) Strategic Plan for 2025 through 2030.

Through innovative data analytics, risk-based oversight, and partnerships with Offices of Inspectors General, law enforcement, state and local oversight offices, and other stakeholders, the PRAC will continue to add value by protecting taxpayer funds from fraud, waste, and abuse.

Over the past five years, the PRAC's analytics platform has created sophisticated data analytics tools and innovative oversight models to prevent and detect fraud, waste, and abuse across federal programs. The PRAC's efforts have yielded significant return on investment in terms of recoveries of stolen taxpayer funds and have provided numerous recommendations to federal agencies on how they can strengthen their anti-fraud controls. We will continue to strategically use these PRAC innovations, prioritizing our efforts to apply fraud prevention and detection tools to federal spending across the programs within our jurisdiction to enhance program integrity.

Based on the PRAC's success, in July 2025, the One Big Beautiful Bill (OB BB) Act (P.L. 119-21) expanded the PRAC's jurisdiction to include programs funded in the OB BB and extended the PRAC's sunset date to September 30, 2034.

This Strategic Plan is designed to help inform the public, Congress, and other stakeholders about the crucial mission of the PRAC in preventing improper payments and fraud, and guide PRAC team members as they deliver high-quality, impactful, independent oversight of pandemic spending and programs funded in the OB BB Act.

About the Pandemic Response Accountability Committee

Established in March 2020 by the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act, the PRAC is a Committee of the Council of the Inspectors General on Integrity and Efficiency (CIGIE). Established within the executive branch by the Inspector General Act of 1978, as amended, CIGIE is an independent entity that includes over 70 statutorily created federal Inspectors General (IGs).

The CARES Act identifies IGs from nine agencies as statutory members of the PRAC. The PRAC Chair can designate additional IGs to serve on the Committee from any agency that receives covered funds or is involved in the federal government's response to the COVID pandemic. The IGs serving on the Committee continue to perform their IG duties.

The PRAC promotes transparency by providing Congress and the public with objective, reliable information and we work with IGs to recommend program improvements, refer matters for criminal investigations, and identify misspent funds for recovery. Our reports and other resources are available at PandemicOversight.gov.

The PRAC provides data-driven, risk-based oversight of covered funds, which includes over \$5 trillion in pandemic relief funds and programs funded in the One Big Beautiful Bill (OBBB) Act (P.L. 119-21). In July 2025, the OBBB Act amended the CARES Act to extend the PRAC until September 30, 2034 and expanded the PRAC's jurisdiction to include programs funded in the OBBB Act.
