

The U.S. Department of the Treasury made available \$150B in Coronavirus Relief Funds (CRF) to states, eligible local governments, Tribal governments, the District of Columbia, and the U.S. Territories (i.e., prime recipients).

Prime recipients must submit quarterly reports on sub-recipient spending for greater than or equal to \$50k. For expenses less than \$50k, prime recipients report total amounts by funding type (e.g., grants, contracts, loans). A total of 785 prime recipients received \$149.5B in CRF. Out of those recipients, 760 each received at least \$150k and must report under the CARES Act.


